Now Writing His Memoirs**

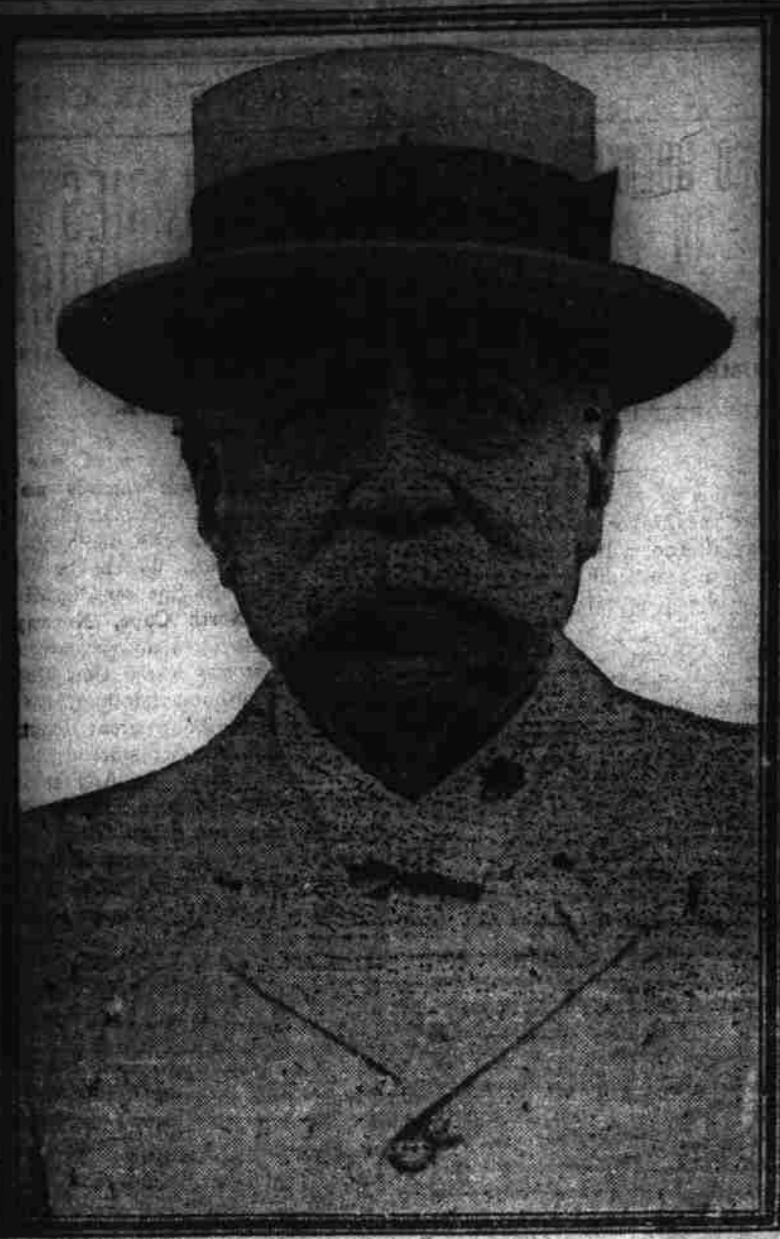
