Uncle Sam Faces Another War Problem

IT IS STATUS OF FOREIGN-BORN SAILORS, BUT CITIZENS, ON AMERICAN SHIPS

Washington, Oct. 5.—One of the most delicate questions that has arisen as a result of the European war relates to the status of foreign-born sailors on American ships, who either have become naturalized American citizens or have taken out preliminary papers. Already several cases have arisen which had led to an exchange of views between the State Department and British officials, and at present an active correspondence is in progress in the effort to secure a clear understanding as to the exemption from arrest of such sailors when they are carried into British ports in the ordinary voyage of their ships.

One of the first cases arose in Halifax, N. S., where a sailor of German birth who had taken out preliminary papers went ashore from an American ship and was arrested by the Canadian authorities. The American consul promptly intervened and secured the release of the sailor. More recently, in the Far East, sailors of German birth who had "declared their intention" to become American citizens, were taken off American ships in British ports under the claim they were were reservists. These men subsequently released, but warned not to return under penalty of being arrested.

The State Department is understood to take the position that where a sailor is fully naturalized there can be no question of his exemption from arrest, in view of the fact that Great Britain has recognized the right of naturalization in her treaties with the United States. In cases where the sailor has taken only the preliminary steps towards naturalization he will be protected on the high seas certainly, and probably even in a British port, providing he does not land from his ship.

KILLED MAN HE TOOK FOR BEAR

HARRISONBURG, VA., October 5.—While up a tree gathering chestnuts yesterday in the Allegheny Mountains twenty miles west of here, Prince Lilly, twenty-three years old, was accidentally shot and killed by David Reid, an old Confederate soldier, who thought he had a bear tree. As Lilly fell from the tree, Reid attempted suicide, but was prevented by the dead man's cousin.
