ORDINANCES

Alderman Ellis, moved the adoption of the following ordinances. Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, of the ordinance of the city be amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

Sec. 29. Whoever stops a street car on a footway or common crossing used by pedestrians shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined the sum of one dollar. Motion seconded and upon roll call adopted.

Alderman Scott moved the adoption of the following ordinances. Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Sec. 43. Whoever places or maintains any peanut roaster on any sidewalk in the city shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined the sum of Five Dollars for each offense. Motion seconded and carried.

Alderman Satterthwaite moved the adoption of the following ordinance. Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Section 1. That Chapter 5 of the ordinance of the city be amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

Sec. 30. It shall be unlawful for any person driving an automobile, carriage, dray, wagon or other vehicle, to stop for a longer period than ten minutes, such automobile, carriage, dray, wagon, or other vehicle, in Griffin or Queen streets in front of the brick building situate at the northeast corner of said streets. Whoever violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined the sum of Five Dollars.

Alderman Ellis, moved the adoption of the following ordinance. Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Section 1. That chapter 16 of the ordinance of the city be amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

Sec. 7. No bill shall be approved or allowed by the Board for payment until the same shall have been approved in writing by the Chairman of the Committee authorizing such expenditure, and no bill shall be made or work entered into unless authorized by Chairman of Committee. Alderman Hall seconded the motion and upon roll call the same was adopted.

Alderman Satterthwaite moved the adoption of the following ordinance. Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern:

Section 1. That chapter 4 of the ordinances of the city be amended by adding at the end thereof the following sections:

Sec. 41. Whoever engages in switching, making up trains, or shifting railroad cars, engines or trams, on or through Crescent street between the hours of 8 o'clock p. m. and 7 o'clock a. m.: or whoever allows any railroad car or engine to stand on said street for a longer period than ten minutes shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined Five Dollars for the first and Ten Dollars for the second offense.

Sec. 42. Whoever shall maintain a railroad track in Crescent street without covering the cross-ties thereof and keeping said street in good order shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined the sum of Fifty Dollars, and each day any such track is maintained in violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

BRITISH NAVY AND THE TROOPS ADDLE GERMANS

Sturdy Teutons Putting Up Remarkable Fight But the Odds Against Them Seem Too Great

THE ENGLISH VESSELS ARE SHELLING OSTEND

The Men-O'-War Have Begun to Play An Active Part In the World's Greatest Conflict

LONDON, Oct. 22—Reports that the Germans had evacuated Ostend and were retreating toward Bruges and that their west Flanders army from the vicinity of the coast south to Courtrai was being hammered into a zig-zag line by the combined efforts of the British navy and the British, French and Belgian troops, seemed to coincide at so many points today that, in the absence of claims of any advances from Berlin, opinion here was that the fighting among the canals of North Belgium had been generally against the invaders.

It is clear now that ships have been playing an important part in the warfare along the coast. The admiralty officially announced that the monitors Severn, Humber, and Merzy, not only bombarded the German position south of Ostend, but landed detachments of marines with machine guns.

It is reported from other sources that eleven war vessels in all are taking part in the operations, but they are not named.

Curiously enough, the monitors retain that title from 'Lincoln's cheese box' of Civil war fame, and so far apparently they have been able to dodge submarine attacks. How the German submarines got to Ostend is unknown. With the fighting along the Belgian coast, hardly more than seventy miles from Dover, the area of hostilities necessarily holds chief interest with the British public, though according to last night's Paris official communication there were violent actions here and there along more than a seventy-mile front, extending almost due north and south from Neu port to Labasse. Everywhere the Allies claimed to be holding their positions.

Reinforcements for the German right have been spoken of daily since Ostend was taken, and today comes a report that Austrian forces were being transferred from the Italian frontier for this purpose.

Rumors that Emperor William is seriously ill are filtering in here via Paris, and this with a report that a German fleet is off Falsterbo, Sweden, are among the usual crop of unconfirmed news items that London is dis-
