

1,250,000 men, women and children are war refugees in Holland, England, and France. A large proportion of the men are skilled agriculturists, and thousands are specialists in the growing of vegetables, fruits or flowers, in dairying and in the raising of livestock and poultry. A large proportion of the farming class own small farms in Belgium, from which they were driven by the contending armies, and information from Holland and England is to the effect that most of them have abandoned all hope of returning to their farms for many months, if at all.
