Fulford

Met His Death Last WOODMEN MAKE Night On New South Front Street at the Hands of Forty Houses Visited By Rain Failed to Dampen Will Not Celebrate the Oc-Jesse Creel---His Slayer In Jail--Affair Created Much Excitement.

Gannon Fulford, thirty years of age and a son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Fulford who reside at No. 309 Spencer avenue, Ghent, was almost instantly killed on New South Front street at 8 o'clock last evening when he was stabbed with a knife in the hands of Jesse Creel sixty years of age and whose home is at No. 3 New South Front steret.

The wound was in Fulford's throat and the cartroid artery was severed, Creel was placed under accest by Chief of Police C. Lupton a short time after the affait and incarcer ated in the Craven county jail. The body of the slain man was carried to the home of his parents where it will remain until tomorrow morning when the funeral service will be conducted and the remains interred in Cedar Grove cemetery.
