**Newspaper Man At Rocky Mount Sees Things**

Tuesday's issue of the Rocky Mount Telegram has the following item of interest:

Within a few minutes before and after twelve-thirty today there was an unusual phenomena of the weather hereabouts when a cloud, as if of a summer storm kept away the noonday light and it was necessary for about five minutes to bring the electric lights into play in the banks and business houses.
