

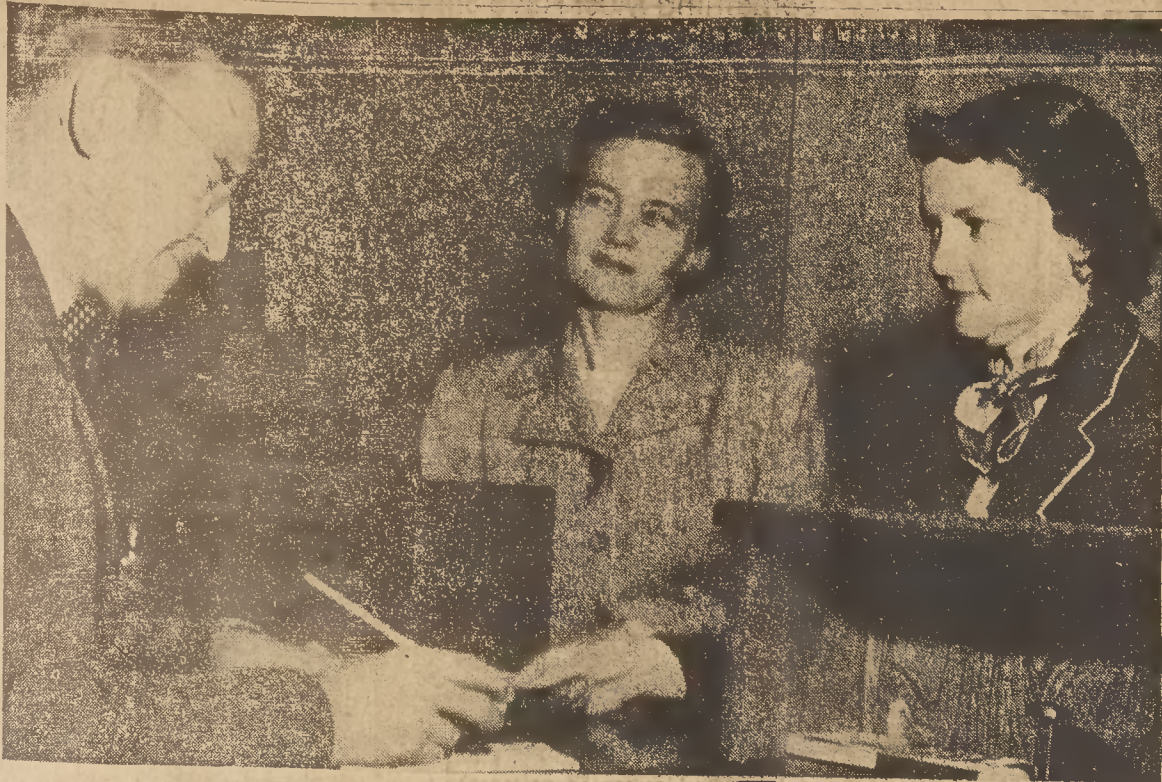
Holy Family Bazaar Planned Next Tuesday
