**The County Agents Say:**  
**MILLERS EXPERIMENT WITH BEEF CATTLE**  
 Bill and Minic Miller are primarily interested in poultry, however, they have developed one of the best permanent pastures in the county.  
 In trying to make this pasture pay they have experimented with beef cattle for the past several years. Last September they bought several lots of feeder calves which they turned into their pasture and kept them on pasture all through the winter and until these animals were sold without feeding them anything else except approximately ½ ton of hay each through the winter.  
 The Millers have kept accurate records on this experiment. They have kindly provided us with their figures. On the first lot of 11 beef calves bought in September at an average weight of 415 pounds the cost was \$17.50 per 100 pounds or \$72.62 per head. These calves were sold after 10 months on pasture and averaged 750 pounds weight and sold for \$17.75 per 100 pounds or an average of 133.12 per head giving them a net of \$60.50 per head.  
 The second group of 11 calves for part of the bonds of any issue (having the earliest maturities, and another rate or rates for the balance, but no bid may name more than four rates for any issue, and each bidder must specify in his bid the amount of bonds of each rate. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder offering to purchase the bonds at the lowest interest cost to the Town, such cost to be determined by deducting the total amount of the premium bid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the bonds until their respective maturities. No bid for less than all of the bonds offered will be entertained.

was also bought in September and averaged 550 pounds each, costing \$15.75 per 100 pounds or \$86.62 apiece. These were better calves and grew out faster and were sold in April after 7 months on pasture. They weighed an average of 350 pounds and sold at \$19.39 per 100 pounds or an average of \$164.31 each giving a net per animal of \$78.19.  
 The Millers are careful to point out that they were only able to get these gains because of excellent pasture, and since they have carried on this experiment only one year they would not like to give the impression that the same results could be obtained as a usual practice.
