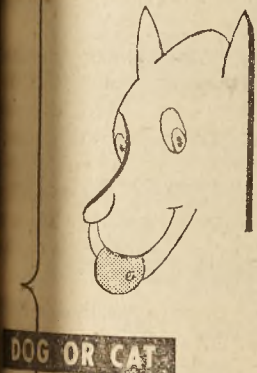
The Rev. Mr. Benjamin, rector of the church, performed the ceremony. The couple will live at 1208 Bierna Avenue, Huntsville, Alabama.

Betrothal Of Miss Dicks To Mr. Connelly Is Announced; December Wedding Is Planned

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Peel Dicks, of Rockingham, announce the engagement of their daughter, Miss Jane Dozier Dicks of Chapel Hill to John Waldo Connelly, Jr., of Washington, D. C., son of the late John W. Connelly, and of Mrs. John W. Connelly, of Washington. A December wedding is planned.

Miss Dicks was presented at the Debutante Ball in Raleigh. She attended the College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia, and the University of North Carolina. During World War II she served as a WAC Captain in the South Pacific.

Following the war Miss Dicks lived in the Philippines and Japan. She is the granddaughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Richard Dozier Lee, of Sumter, South Carolina, and the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert Peel Dicks, of Randleman.

Mr. Connelly studied in Switzerland, University of Buenos Aires, Georgetown University, Yale and Harvard. He is a member of the University Club, Washington, and the American Bar Association. For several years he was with the State Department in South America and served on several international commissions in Austria and Turkey.

During World War II Mr. Connelly handled Military Lend Lease equipment in Brazil and Italy. From 1945-48 he was Director of the Department of Justice in Korea.

Discharged from the Army as a Lieutenant Colonel he studied Russian affairs and recently returned to Washington where he has been engaged in research and legal consultation. In the early part of 1956 Mr. Connelly will go to the Orient to establish a Korean Legal Center in Seoul for research in comparative law.

How The Village Cooks

For an authority on buffet suppers, one need look no further than Mrs. Jake Wade. Because of her competent entertaining, you may be sure that she has worked out all the problems of this type of meal and can give us many helpful hints leading to a successful party.

Recipes and hints may be found in the revised and enlarged "Carolina Cooking" now on sale throughout the town. Here we will limit ourselves to the menu and the recipe for the unusual oyster sandwiches.

Suggested menu: Baked Smithfield ham, sliced cold turkey, baked beans with onion, oyster sandwiches, whole artichoke pickle, dill pickle, onion rings, party rye bread and coffee.

OYSTER SANDWICHES

Put a large layer of oysters in a buttered casserole, alternating with a layer of Snow's condensed Clam Chowder, a layer of pepperidge Farm dressing. Dot with butter and plenty of salt and pepper. Keep two or three dishes hot in oven and take one at a time to the table. Serve on slices of party rye bread. Keep clam chowder hot on top of stove and after adding to oysters it will only take a few minutes to warm.

Hints: Have at least four pyrex dishes for your oysters. Be sure to use condensed chowder and do not dilute it. I put two pieces of party rye bread on the plate and

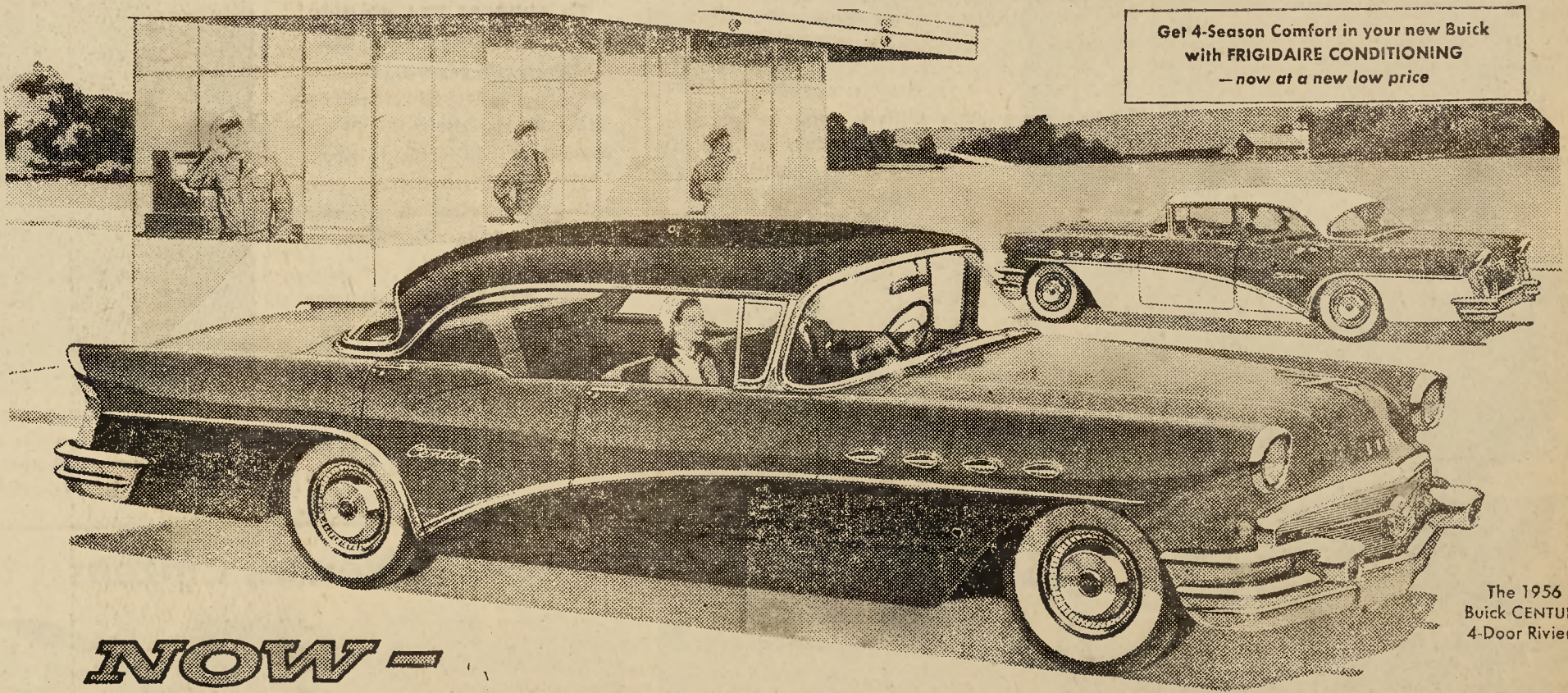
cover with oysters. They of course have to be eaten with a fork.
