

# County Tax Listers Meet, Make Plans For Annual January Work

The tax listers of the county met at the courthouse Tuesday for a schooling on methods for the 1955 tax listings. The school was under the supervision of S. M. Gattis, County Tax Supervisor.

During the meeting tax listing forms were given to list takers as well as information and instructions on the procedures for the tax listing which begins in the county on January 3rd.

Gattis stated that the law requires every resident of the county regardless of age, to give in his personal and real property for tax purposes. In order to make it easier for tax payers, Gattis stated that the list takers at a future date will announce a schedule as to where they will be during the period.

It was also stressed to the registrars by Gattis, to get correct name, age and address of tax payers. Gattis pointed out that all male's 21-50 years of age are liable for poll tax, unless specially exempted by law.

As a yard stick for obtaining the values of automobiles, the county commissioner voted to use again valuations as set up on cost loan value in the National Used Car Market Report. Tractors will be valued in accordance with the National Farm Implement Book based on an average cost value.

A complete list of livestock schedule to be used for 1955 tax listings has been approved, including horses, mules, hogs, milk cattle, beef cattle, and bulls.

Each lister was given a guide to follow in listing personal property. Prepared by the tax supervisor upon instructions of the County Commissioners, the guide contains average values for various types of personal property such as electrical appliances and farm machinery at various ages in their existence to enable the lister to check on items given in by the taxpayers.

This is designed to secure more uniform and equitable listing and fairer values on the tax books in line with those of real property.

Also handed the list takers were the new values for livestock of all kinds. They are:

Milk Cattle — purebred, \$105; good, \$70; Grade, \$35.

Beef Cattle — pure bred bulls, \$105; pure bred heifers over 15 months of age, \$105; pure bred heifers under 15 months of age, \$70; pure bred cows, \$105; other cows, \$50; other heifers over 15 months, \$50; other heifers under 15 months, \$30.

Hogs—on foot, \$15; pigs under 10 weeks, \$4.

Chickens—hens (heavy, 5 lbs. and over), 70c; hens (light, less than 5 lbs.), 30c; broilers, 30c; biddies, 10c.

Horses—first class, \$50; other grades scaled down.

Mules—first class, \$60; other grades scaled down.

## More Liberal Pensions For Korean Vets

Korean veterans with active service on or after June 27, 1950 and on or before January 31, 1955, who become permanently and totally disabled for reasons not traceable to his service in the Armed Forces may be entitled to pension.

They must have been discharged under conditions other than dishonorable after a minimum of 10 days service, unless discharged for disability incurred in line of duty in less than 90 days.

The pension is payable only if the veteran's income does not exceed \$1,400 a year without dependents, or \$2,700 if he is married or has a minor child.

The monthly rate is \$66.15 which is increased to \$78.75 after 10 years or when the veteran reaches age 65.

Veterans who are entitled to pension and who are so helpless as to need the regular aid and attendance of another person may be eligible for the top pension payment of \$135.45 per month. This rate does not always apply when the veteran is being hospitalized by the VA or is receiving VA domiciliary care.

## ASC To Attempt To Reach More Folks In '56

One objective of Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation of office in the county next year will be to reach every farmer who has not participated in ASC's conservation program for a number of years.

A. K. McAdams, office manager of the local ASC, reports that all counties in the State have been requested to make a special analysis of participation in the ASC program for 1952, '53, '54, and '55. The results of this analysis will be used in each office in a concerted attempt to reach new farms and new farmers.

January 3rd through 23rd has been set as the time for signing up for ACP practices for the coming year.

Farmers in Orange County as well as throughout the State in 1956 will have an opportunity of making better use of their Agricultural Conservation Program than ever before, according to McAdams. With allotments on tobacco, cotton and wheat, and with the need to shift production from some of the acreage in those crops, all farmers have an opportunity to use the agricultural conservation program in the seeding of grass and legumes. In doing this farmers will not only be helping to bring production into balance, but they will be building reserves in the soil for future needs.

ACP assistance for these practices is available to every farmer in every county and throughout the State. According to McAdams, however, in order for the overall benefits to be realized by all people, every farmer must be conservation minded. Public money is being spent in this vital conservation effort, and the public will best be served if all farmers participate, McAdams said.
