Miss Mary Edwards of Springfield attended her sister as maid of honor and Miss Mary Gillespie of Columbus, Ohio was bridesmaid.

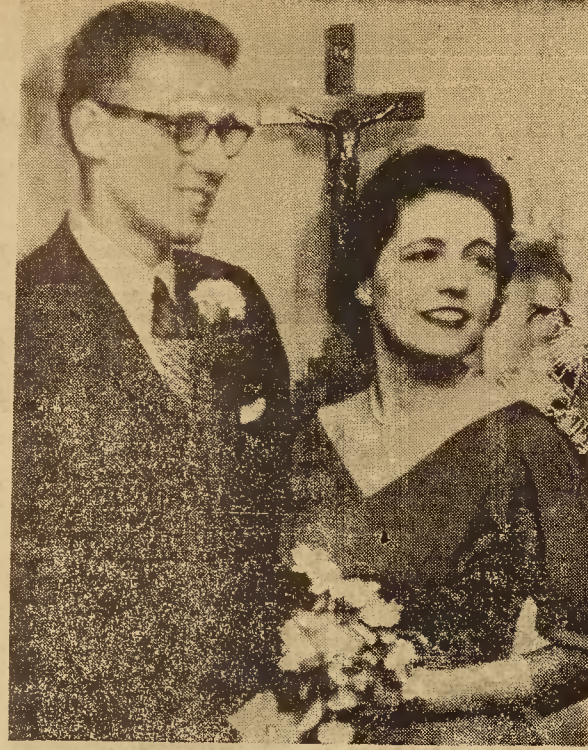
