Racing Fines Are Appealed In Court Here

Fines of \$75 and costs on charges of racing on the public highways have been appealed from the Chapel Hill Recorder's Court by two local youths.

Judge William S. Stewart levied the fines after finding the defendants, Carl B. Briles, and Dickerson E. Marlow, guilty of racing on the Smith Level Road south of Carrboro last Saturday afternoon. Both pleaded not guilty to the charges but offered no testimony. They were released on bond pending trial by jury in Orange County Superior Court at Hillsboro.

State's witnesses Clarence Cole and Mrs. Durwood Scott told the court they saw the two cars in which the defendants were later arrested speed by their Smith Level Road homes in both directions late Saturday afternoon. Patrolman Thomas B. Winborne arrested the pair in Carrboro a short while after the incident was reported.

Local police and highway patrolmen have noted several reports of racing in recent weeks on the Smith Level Road and the bypass Highway.
