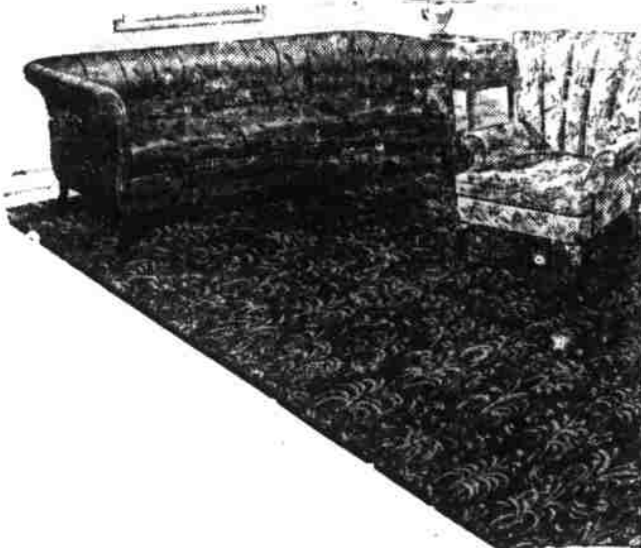

STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

Question: Can peanut meal or soybean oil meal be used in a hog ration?

Answer: Dr. W. J. Peterson, in charge of animal nutrition research at N. C. State College, says that peanut meal or soybean oil meal may be used as the sole protein supplement for fattening pigs with initial weights of 100 pounds or more that have, prior to this time, been fed rations that contain ample animal protein and succulent grazing. Peanut meal in proportions as high as one part of peanut meal to 1 to 3 parts of corn usually produce soft carcasses, whereas one part of peanut meal to 5 or more parts of corn produce good quality carcasses.

Question: What are some of the species to avoid when planting trees for shade?

Answer: A partial list of undesirable shade trees, as prepared by John H. Harris, Extension landscape specialist of N. C. State College, is as follows: Silver Maple, Boxelder, Sillertree (also called Mimosa), Texas Umbrella-tree, Chinaberry, Lombardy Poplar, White Poplar, Carolina Poplar, Chinese Elm, and American Chestnut. He emphasized, however, that some of these trees serve well for purposes other than shade.

Question: May a farmer buy materials for home-mixing of fertilizer under the Chemical Fertilizer Conservation Program?

Answer: Dr. E. R. Collins, Extension agronomy leader of N. C. State College, says that a farmer who home-mixed fertilizer in 1941 and purchased materials, is eligible to buy the materials for home-mixing in 1942. He said that fertilizer dealers are required to sell materials to such farmers, since the 1942-43 sales are based on practices of 1940-41. He suggested that a farmer to sell mixed fertilizer to place of materials should be reported to the nearest War Production Board office if the dealer is acting against the wishes of the eligible purchaser in insisting on selling mixed fertilizers.

Question: What is the best type of milk bucket?

Answer: Where hand-milking is done, a hooded or small top milk bucket is preferred. This type of bucket will exclude about 50 percent of the number of bacteria which usually get into the milk during the milking process. The strainer should be sealed and constructed to use standard filter discs. Milk cans and all other utensils used in handling milk should be of standard construction and free from open seams.
