The message was received by Pvt. McManus parents two days after they had received a letter from him stating that he had been wounded and was in an army hospital and was getting along fine. Nothing of a definite nature concerning his injuries was revealed in either of the two communications. However, Pvt. McManus stated in his letter that he "thought he would soon be back home and a civilian again, as my front line duties are over for good."

Pvt. McManus entered the tervice May 19, 1942, and has seen action in both the African and Italian campaigns.


