**LOCAL NEWS**

Wednesday, June 14, is National Flag Day. Local residents are urged to appropriately display the flag that day at their homes and in the business district.

Bridger P. Little, former Marshville resident, who has had his home in Candor for some time, was killed in an automobile wreck near Candor Friday night. No details of the accident were available today. Funeral services were held in the Marshville Baptist church, Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock with interment in the Marshville cemetery. He is survived by his widow, two sons, two brothers and four sisters.

On Wednesday afternoon at five-thirty at the Country Club close to 100 G. I. golfers will start out on a tournament sponsored by the Franklin Street USO. William D. Feldcamp, director, has announced that expenses for this tournament and medals will be furnished by the Franklin Street Center. It is also hoped to have all the entries take part in a banquet at the conclusion of the tournament. There is still a little time for many boys who have not as yet entered. There will please sign up at the Country Club. This is a handicap tournament and your handicap will be given to you before you start," states Mr. Feldcamp. All entries report Wednesday at 5:30 at the Country Club.

Official totals compiled by the State Board of Elections in canvassing the vote in the Democratic primary of May 27 shows the ballots aggregated more than 319,000 votes. The combined vote for Greg Cherry and Dr. Ralph McDonald was 319,688 votes. It was considered probable that some voters did not vote for either of these two candidates in the nomination for governor, which would make the total vote run higher. Cherry polled 185,027 votes; McDonald 134,661. In the campaign for the nomination for the U. S. Senate, Clyde B. Hoey totaled 211,049 to 90,154 for Cameron Morrison, his closest opponent. Hoey's four opponents in Union county Hoey received 1,742 and Morrison 946. In the governor's race, Cherry received a total of 1766 and McDonald 1050.

Mr. and Mrs. J. F. McManus of South Parker street, yesterday received a message from the War Department stating that their son, Pvt. Hoyce McManus, was seriously wounded in Italy on May 28. The message was received by Pvt. McManus' parents two days after they had received a letter from him stating that he had been wounded and was in an army hospital and was getting along fine. Nothing of a definite nature concerning his injuries was revealed in either of the two communications. However, Pvt. McManus stated in his letter that he "thought he would soon be back home and a civilian again, as my front line duties are over for good." Pvt. McManus entered the service May 18, 1942, and has seen action in both the African and Italian campaigns.

Eight hundred and sixty soldiers took advantage of free swimming classes for service men at the Monroe Municipal pool last week. These classes were inaugurated by the 93rd Central Postal Directory, sponsored by the Monroe Park and Recreation commission. Three rehabilitation classes are held each week for convalescents from the Station Hospital. The free picnic grounds and barbecue pit on the Country Club grounds were used by 700 soldiers and five bus loads of girls. Good food, swimming and dancing were enjoyed. The soldiers' Recreation program, supervised by Amos Beck will feature outdoor activities during the summer and take full advantage of the fine facilities of the Park and Recreation commission in entertaining the service men. Particular attention will be given to disabled and convalescents from the battle front. Col. Elman, executive officer of Camp Sutton, was a recent guest at a dinner held at the Westchester Avenue Colored Center. These dinners are held each week at the Soldiers' Town Club for the service men and use of the club and pool.

A former Waxhaw resident, Woodrow W. Bigham, who is now doing war work at the Charleston Navy Yard, recently won a cash award from the Beneficial Suggestions Award Committee of the yard for suggesting a production time-saver. Mr. Bigham, who is employed as a rigger with a mopper rating, proposed that portable signs showing the work request number be placed at the gangplank of all ships under repair or which have different job order numbers than the number painted on their bows. He has a service record of four years in the U. S. Marine Corps and five years with the Merchant Marine.

Cotton prices increased last week reaching a new high for the season to date with spot sales fairly active. Weather conditions were generally favorable to crop progress. The crop is reported to be two to three weeks late. Attention in the cotton and textile markets has centered principally on the strength of cotton prices coincident with the invasion news and on expected congressional action on proposed amendments to the OFA legislation. Prices for middling 15-16 inch in the 10 designated markets averaged 21.37 cents per pound on Friday, June 9, as compared with 21.21.30 a week earlier and 21.16 a year ago. Cotton prices during the week showed considerable strength, reaching the highest levels for the season to date.

Mrs. Helen Arndt of Monroe Friday was placed under \$300 bond by U. S. Commissioner Nat. C. White on a charge of illegally accepting servicemen's allowance checks under the dependency act passed by Congress to provide aid for the wives and families of servicemen. The charge against Mrs. Arndt will be heard in Federal court in Charlotte at the fall term. The case was turned up by the Federal Bureau of Investigation after Mrs. Arndt married a soldier stationed at Fort Jackson, S. C. She learned some time later that her husband was already married, but, according to the charges, she continued to receive dependency checks although not legally married to him. Later she obtained a divorce and married her present husband, who is serving in Italy.
