A Town AT A RIOT.—A Wheeling (W. Va.) special says: There was a regular riot at the little suburban town of Fulton late this evening, which for a time threaten-ed to involve the entire male popu-lation and provide a good deal of work for the coroner. The village is almost entirely populated by Germans and a half dozen or more beer saloons do a flourishing Sun-day business. About 9 o'clock Daniel Campbell went to the house of John Bistell and insulted Bistell's wife. Bistell attacked Campbell with a cane and forced him out on the sidewalk.

Campbell was reinforced by his three brothers Dan, Robert and Philip, and they soon had Bistell on the ground and were beating the life out of him with stones and clabs. This storted the riot Headache.—D. Older, Cedar Repids, clubs. This started the riot. George Culver and his son John joined in the meles. Soon revolvers were cracking merrily and stones, canes and clubs hummed through the air. There is 10 police force in the town and the combatants fought in the dark until citizens made a rush for the rioters and forced a suspension of hostilities.

John H. Bistell was found to be shot through the hip. Samuel Bistell had his face badly cut with a rock, Robert Campbell had one ear chewed and badly clubbed, and others engaged were similarly done up. There are indications that the row is not yet over, and a resumption of hostilities is fear-
