MEETING LAST NIGHT.—An adjourned meeting of the Chamber of Commerce was held in the courthouse last night, which was well attended and participated in with genuine interest. President Gray occupied the chair. Unfinished business was declared in order.

The committee to secure rooms for the permanent occupancy of the Chamber of Commerce, King, chairman, reported verbally having made investigations but no decision as to selection.

The chief business of the meeting was the election of a Board of Arbitration, and Mayor King nominated the following as that committee: W. R. Murray, Wm. Lova, H. W. Cobb, W. H. Wakefield and W. R. Burgess, and on further motion it was ordered that the Secretary and Treasurer cast the vote of the meeting for the list of nominees.

The President then called the names of the various standing committees, but for lack of exact information as to some of the persons appointed, the announcement of the list is deferred. The office of Attorney to the Chamber not being provided for in the by-laws, on motion article 25th to that instrument was drafted, presented and adopted.
