# The Fire Yesterday Morning.

At about z o'clock yesterday (Sunday) morning, persons here and youder, and even at remote distances from the location of the noise, were aroused from their slumber by the shrill, piercing sounds of a steam engine whistle which was evidently scream ing out an alarm to the citizens -it might be a fire; it might be a mob. After a time, however, the chorus was taken up by the court house bell, the engine house to the depot began to eche to the sound of swift runners as the fire department hurrisd on with its implements of war. It was another Sunday morning catastrophe, like the one that came upon the market house a few weeks ago, and that swept away the valuable brick block on South Elm, and including

By reason of one fact, which ought not to be, that the courthouse key is not kept where it can be had at a momen.'s warning, it was sometime before the court house bell began to ring its alarm, but as soon as was p ssible the fire company was at work with that zeal and determination which they always display. When the alarm began to ring the engine was out and had on five pounds of steam. There was no trouble after the engine got at its work. The lo cation of the fire was in the middle of the block of wooden stores between the Guilford House and McDonald street, and when the engine arrived the block was so thoroughly envelop ed in flames that its destruction was inevitable. Five streams of water played on the fire, and with these the fire was confined to the one block. The condition of things was alarmingly critical. It was 25 feet to the Guilford House, and had taken fire the flames would have swept on indefinitely northward, doing incalculable damage. An abundance of water thrown on the Guilford House stayed the progress of the fire in that direction. There was a tarred roof within 8 feet of the burning block, and this shed was saved without injury. Across McDonald street is the brick eating house of Ms. R. L. Vernon, now kept by his brother, Mr. A. T. Vernon: this house caught several times, and was all the while in imminent danger. Had the eating house gone, the ice factory in the rear would have gone, then also the freight depot of the R. and D.
