Rev. W. R. Gwaltney has just returned from the commencement of Judson College, at Hendersonville, where he preached the commencement sermon on the 20th. He says the heat is very great even among the mountains.

Mr. S. L. Alderman, who is a very fine artist, by the way, took two water works views to day, first of the water tower, with a number on the balcony, and then of the pump house with a number of the commissioners, with Mayor Barringer.

Mr. John Lewis, who represented the Greensboro Fire Company at the Virginia Firemen's Conyention at Roanoke, Va., has returned home, and speaks in enthusiastic terms of his reception, and what he saw and heard.

Meeting of City Council.

The Board met at 8:25 last evening, June 22nd., Mayor Barringer in the chair. The following members were present: Price, Odell, Scott, Hawkins, Coffin, Ellington, Beville, White. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

The subject of paving contract was considered in all its details and specifications, and the following in relation thereto was adopted:

RESOLVED, That the contract reported by the paying committee for paving South Elm street be accepted, and that the Mayor be instructed to sign and have the said contract completed with the contractor, Thomas Woodroffe.

Mr. Odell offered a resolution on the subject of insurance, which was adapted, as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED: That every insurance agent doing business in the city of Greensboro be required to make quarterly reports to the Board of Commissioners on the first day of January, April, July and October, the number and names of the persons and property insured by them, the value of property, and the amount thereon, where situated and the kind and description of such property.

That any one violating this ordinance shall be fined \$25.

Mr. Scott offered the following, which was adopted:

RESOLVED, That no trees shall be cut down on South Elm street except such as the paving committee shall decide to be absolutely necessary as the work of paving progresses.

The market house contract, as read, was accepted, leaving the extras which were believed to be necessary, to be included in a separate contract, to be made between the committee and the contractor, and the committee was authorized to contract for extra work after specifications for the same shall have been furnished.

A communication was read from Mr. W. B. Farrar relating to the care of the town clock, but not acted on. Adjourned to Friday night next.
