Trip to Virginia

MR. EDITOR :- I give you an account of my trip to the Virginia State Fire Department as a representative of the Greensboro Fire Department. I left home on Tuesday night, arriving at Lynchburg at a o'clock, a. m. Having several hours to wait for the train to Roanoke I went through No 4 Fire Station and was shown the workings of improved methods They have three men and one horse and one reel h se. The men are paid by the city and required to stay there all the time, excepting one half day per week to spend with their families. They tell me they have been raised from sleep by the telegraph alarm and been on the way to fire in from six to ten seconds, having thrown water two squares away from quarters in three minutes.

Leaving for Roanoke I found the road in splendid condition, and good time was made. Crops for 30 miles looking rather light; the balance of the way crops good We arrived at Roanoke at 9:30, a m., just in time to take part in the grand procession, which was composed of eight or nine fire companies and representatives from others. The city was full of people and the streets beautifully over we repaired to the Skating Rink where everything that one could wish in the way of edibles and lemonade o'clock the Association met in the Opera House where addresses of welcome were delivered and committees on credentials were appointed, also the presentation of a beautiful ice pitcher to the President, whose name I have forgotten Next day the Convention met and discussed a great many topics of interest and value to firemen. At night there was a torch light proces ion and fire works. Next day the Norfolk and Western Railgoad Co. gave a free excursion to the Pocahontas mine.
