A resolution passed its fipal read ing in the North Carolina Senat January 3 oth, asking Congress make an appropriation to erect monument to Hon. Nathaniel Macon In many respects, it is said, Nathaniel Macon was the greatest man of his time. We have heard it advance as the opinion of the foremost of his ntemporaries. It is known that Mr. Macon was one of the few per sons admired and at all times treated deferentially by the eccentric, proud ,itter, scornful John Randolph Roanoke. The tıo men were on
terms of the closest intimacy, so much so that Mr. Randolph willed to his friend several of his fine horses and a quantity of silver ware, in-
cluding a costly chandelier of solid silver and elaburate design. This chandelier was brought out by one
of the descendants of Mr . Macon and made to do service at'a tashion able wedding in Franklin county not a great many years ago, as we learn trom a person who was present on the occasion, and, as a matter of
course, the relic is still in existence. There must have been something very superior in Mr. Macon to have given him such influence over Mr.
Randolph, a man who tolerated very few people, and who seemed to have no real affection for a living soul,
