Lewis, of Raleigh, is in the city and can be seen professionally at the Benbow House to-day and to-morrow. He arrived here last night. The Railroad Commission bill failed on its second reading in the Senate by a vote of 28 to 22. Mr. Jarvis has resigned his position as Minister to Brazil and returned home from Washington. Geo. W. Markman, of Durham, died suddenly on Monday last. The train wreckers that were tried and sent up to court at Reidsville were discovered by two shrewd colored detectives from Richmond, who were employed for the purpose and moved about among the negroes in disguise.

The running off was due to the necessary incompetency of the temporary track laid for going by the wreck, the curve being short and the work rough.
