Important Action in the U. S. Court.-The suit against Col. R M. Dooglat, recently decided in hin was brought by the United States upon his official bond for damages resulting from the alleged loss of resur thousond gallons of whiskey in 1880, trom the distillery warebous of W. H. Winstead in Person countr It was admitted that marshal
Douglas personally was in no way to blame ; but the Government contend d that the loss occurred through the negligence of his Deputy, for whose acts and omissons the Marshan's bond was responsible. This was denied by the defendents, and the verdict o the Jury sustained them.
Indeed, so clearly, were the facts in tavor of Col. Douglas that he intro. luced no wituesses whatever, although he had several in attendance and the case was decided in his tayor solely on the teatimony offered by the Government.
