IN ACCORDANCE WITH POW-In accordance with Powers granted to the "Greenborg
Female Col ege Association," by the
Legislature at its session of 1889, giving
said association municipal powers, the
Board of D recters met April 16th, 1889,
and passed the following ordinances:

1st. That any and all persons who
shall enter on the grounds of said association, and while there do any set
which is calculated to excite or put in
fear, annoy or disjurb the quiet or

fear, annoy or disturb the quiet or perce of my student in attendance on the school of the association, while in or out of school or any teacher or superin-t indent or other cofficer thereof, or do any act to interfere with or induce any student in school as aforesaid to violate or to do anything contrary to the rules or discipline of the school, shall 'e guil-ty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction each and every person shall pay a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars or imprisonment at the decretion of the court.

2nd. That every person found guity of loud and boisterous cursing or swear, ing in the buildings or on the grounds of the association or be found drunk or disorderly, or down, or disturbing, or in any way interfering with the peace and good order, comfort and quiet of the students or any one of them in atten-dance on the school of the association, while on the grounds of said association or be found violating the rules of decency, shall upon conviction thereof pay a five of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars or imprisonment at the discreti n of the court.

3rd. Any person who shall be guilty of disorderly conduct at any exhibition or public meeting on the grounds of the association or shall in any way disturb or annoy any audience therein or thereon shall upon conviction pay a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars or imprisonment at the discretion of the court, and shall further be liable and it shall be the duty of any of-

ficer to immediately eject such persons from the premises of the association. 4th. That if any two or more per-sons shall assemble or come together in the buildings or on the grounds of the association and indulge in drinking spirituous, fermented or malt liquors, shall be guilty of a misden canor and on conviction thereof shall each pay a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment at the disretion of the court.

5th. That any and all persons who shall indecently expose themselves or do of the a sociation, shall so cappay a fine of not less than five in the bre than fifty dollars, or imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

6th. That Prof. Dred Percock be and is hereby appointed police, as pro-vided in and with the powers prescribed in an act of the Gener I Assembly of North Carolina passed at its session held in 1889 entitled an act to amend chapter 57th private laws of the note of 1883 &c.
