years ago he started in business as opening of a fruit store in the Spring. He told me some of the secrets of the trade yesterday.

"It only takes twenty shines for a dollar," he said, "and any good bootblack can make from \$2 50 to to \$4 a day, with good custom. That is a good deal more than a majority of the clerks in the stores make. It is better than the pay barbers receive. It is more than - street car drivers get, and it isn't a bad sort of job at all after one gets used to it. I have belped start about a dozen young men. Some of them bad to take stands where they couldn't get more than twenty-five shines a day, but they were saving and industrious, and worked up the trade to more than that. Finally they were able to buy out the stand, and are now doing well. A bootblack with a corner stand must be attentive to business, though, because after he has made a regular customer out of a man he can very easily lose him by carelessness.

"It is a mi-taken notion that a good many people bave," he con-tinued, "this idea that we Italians only care to save two or three lumdred dollars and go back to Italy. The majority of the young men who come, who have any education, desire to become citizens and establish themselves in business, and the majority of the young men you are to day with such stands as wine will in a few years own little rates or be doing some other per-Test And no of that class wish to go back."—N.
