Salesman—Upon each itinerant salesman who shall expose for sale either on the street or in a house rented temporarily for that purpose, goods, wares or merchandise, either as a principal or agent a special tax of 100.00

(Provided, that this tax shall apply whether such exhibition is given in a licensed or unlicensed hall.)

It was ordered by the Board of Aldermen that all parties are notified that special and privilege taxes must be paid to the town tax collector on or before July 1, 1925. If the same be not paid on demand, the amount may be recovered by distress and sale of the articles which have been levied upon or any other property of the owner which may be distrained and sold to satisfy said taxes. See Section 14 Chapter 127, Private Laws of 1885.
