PROPER FOOD FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

The age during which children are attending school may aptly be called "The Dangerous Age." It is the period of rapid growth and every care should be taken to insure the child of a nor-mal and healthy body. The idea of enting only fit and wholesome foods should be easily impressed on the younger members of every family in order to protect them against later Ill health and its accompanying unhappiness. If the utmost care is not taken in the diet that is used by children, cases of food poisoning, indigestion and kindred aliments may result.

And milk, being the chief item in the diets of most children, should be carefully guarded. It is, because of posed to germs and may soon become unfit for use.
