## Negro Masons Make Pledge To Buy Bonds

At a meeting of the Negro Grand Lodge, F. and A. M. of North Carolina, held in Elizabeth City last week, they pledged themselves to buy \$2,000 worth of Government War Bonds.

Dr. James E. Shepard of the North Carolina College for Negroes at Durham is the Grand Master.

In his annual message the Grand Master laid special emphasis on war activities and the willing support that should be given those in authority that would hasten the end of the conflict and shorten the period of sacrifice and suffering.

He stressed the idea of buying bonds and stamps by individual Masons and local lodges as a safe investment and a patriotic service.

More than 200 delegates representing as many local lodges and localities over the State suspended the rule and unanimously adopted the recommendation of the Grand Master for the Grand Lodge to purchase out of its surplus funds \$2,000 worth of government War Bonds in the name of the order.

Mayor J. B. Floro of Elizabeth City spoke words of welcome Tuesday night that were highly appreciated. A contribution of \$200 was raised for the Negro Orphanage at Oxford. All the Grand Officers were reelected for another year.
