Husband And Wife Income Returns

A husband filing a separate Federal income tax return for 1935 may claim his wife's 1935 exemption if she had no income and was the dependent of another taxpayer. Mr. J. E. Wall, District Director of Internal Revenue for the Third District Office, pointed out today.

Husband and wife may file a joint return even though one of them had no income or deductions for the year. But if the wife had any income at all, they may file either a joint return or separate returns. A joint return must include all of the income of both husband and wife. If each files a separate return, the husband may not claim an exemption for his wife or vice versa, he added.

For example, suppose that a wife earned \$400 from which \$50 income tax was withheld. If she filed a separate return in 1935, her \$50 refund the husband is not permitted to claim an exemption for her on his return.

If husband and wife file separate returns, both must use the standard deduction, or both must claim their actual deductions. One cannot use the standard deduction and the other use the standard deduction.

Taxpayers who have any questions about filing by husband and wife may get Document 5013, "Personal Exemptions and Dependents," by writing to their local Internal Revenue Office.
