**Widespread Flood, Tornado ARC Relief Operations In East And South**

Widespread disaster relief operations are under way by the Red Cross in the East and South following last Tuesday's rash of tornadoes in Alabama, Mississippi and Tennessee, and continuing major floods in at least six states.

Preliminary reports from ARC chapters in Kentucky, West Virginia, and Virginia indicate more than 7,000 floodwaters. ARC National Disaster Director, Robert Edson said these figures may be expected to increase substantially as rivers crest, creating a flood disaster in that area approaching the January, 1957, flood on which ARC spent nearly \$4,000,000 for aid to 9,500 families.

In the South, preliminary counts indicate at least 1,200 families hit by twisters and floods happening within the past week in Tennessee, Mississippi and Alabama. Tuesday twisters struck in nine Alabama counties, four in Tennessee and five in Mississippi. Heavy flooding is current particularly at Huntsville and Athens, Alabama, and at Newport, McMinnville, Sevierville, and Sweetwater, Tennessee. Shelters are in operation at most major flood points.

In most tornado-stricken sections, in the South, cleanup already is well under way, and there has been little need for mass shelter, most

victims readily finding temporary haven with relatives and friends. Twenty-eight Red Cross chapters gave emergency aid, and already registration points have been set up at most disaster locations where families may apply for homes reconstruction, refurnishing, medical and other assistance.

Approximately 200 disaster staff members of the national Red Cross are assigned to flood and tornado areas in the East and South, working with local chapters.
