District 4-H Demonstration Day Held In Kenansville - Compile Highest Score

Duplin County 4-H'ers compiled the highest score in the 17 counties last Thursday at Kenansville. The activity was the 4-H District Demonstration Day.

Some 300 contestants from southeastern, North Carolina were participating.

Rev. Lauren Searpe, Mayor of Kenansville was the principal afternoon speaker. The Mayor congratulated the contestants and their achievements and told of his recent visit to New York in which he saw the Astronauts on parade, and also on the same trip he toured the Bowery; Scenes depicting success and failure.
