## What Questions Vets Are Asking

Here are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to questions from former servicemen and their families.

Q- My GI insurance premium was due last week. Must I make formal application for reinstatement?

A-No. You have 31 days of grace from the date your premium was due to make payment and avoid a policy lapse.

Q- If I should die, what must my wife do in order to qualify for a VA pension?

A- She should write, telephone or visit the nearest VA office (there is at least one in every state) to see if she is eligible for pension under the statutory income limitation. The VA will explain this to her and send her the necessary applications forms.

Q- What is the final date of settlement of World War II veterans for a GI ban?

A- In no case will the settlement of an eligible World War II veteran extend beyond July 25, 1967.


