ASCS Committee Elections in September

County and community committeemen, who will administer ASCS programs in 1963 will be elected by their fellow farmers in September, according to Rufus Elks, Jr., Manager, Duplin ASCS County Office. These committeemen will take office October 1. Elks says that current county committeemen are responsible for seeing that all phases of the election are properly performed in accordance with regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture. Present county committeemen will select a slate of six or more eligible nominees to be voted upon in this year's election. The list of nominees will include the names of all persons who may be nominated by proper petition to the county ASCS office. Any farm tenant, operator, or owner may vote in the community elections if he is now participating or is eligible to participate in any of the programs administered by the county ASC committee. Elks urges all farmers to vote in the committee elections. He says that these committeemen perform very vital work in the administration of all ASCS farm programs. Their vital role makes it especially important for all farmers to participate in the selection of the best qualified persons as committeemen.

Annual Report Of E. H. A. Activities

The Duplin County Farmers Home Administration office had its largest year ever, loaning one and one quarter million dollars to Duplin residents, reported B. A. Parker, Jr., County Supervisor. A breakdown of the use of loan funds shows that \$443,060 was used for operating and emergency loans. This amount was used to purchase livestock and farm machinery, small minor real estate improvements, and provide funds for annual operating expenses such as fertilizer, seed, insecticides, fuel, and labor. Twenty-four loans were made in the amount of \$322,900 to purchase farms, develop farm land and buildings and refinancing debts on longer terms. Thirty-six new homes were constructed under the Rural Housing Program for a total amount of \$380,850. This was the only type loan where there was a shortage of funds and some applications had to be carried over to the new fiscal year. One Soil and Water Association loan was made under our new Recreational loan policies in the amount of \$100,000. These funds went to provide recreational facilities for 200 Duplin families. This was the first loan of its type made in the nation. A second loan of similar nature in the county is now in process. There were 341 new applications made last fiscal year from Duplin families; the largest number received in any county in the state. Our six hundred farm visits were made to families to assist them in farm planning, record keeping, construction, development, and in carrying out planned practices. More than 1500 office visits were made by applicants and borrowers and other persons seeking financial assistance. Collections for the 1962 fiscal year amounted to 98.6 per cent of all.
