that along in the fifties tobacco acreage was being curtailed and there was great concern, especially in Duplin, as to how they would replace this antici-pated six million or eight mil-lion dollar loss in the curtailment of tobacco acreage. Poultry was suggested as one source from which they could increase their gross farm income and it is my understanding that poultry contributed a-round twelve million to the gross farm income in Duplin

County within just a few years. In North Carolina in 1960 we produced 156,600,000 broilers which were valued at \$82. 685,000 and in 1962 we produced 203,126,000 which yielded a gross farm income of \$98,760,000-making broilers the second largest farm income in North Carolina, being second only to tobacco. The total gross income from poultry and poultry products in 1962 was \$191, 060,000.

Poultry has exerted a tremendous impact upon our economic life in North Carolina and, in Duplin County think what poultry means to the people of the county. It has brought feed mills to your county it has supplied employment of several hundred people who did not have jobs before, and the value of the poultry meat is several million dollars annually. So it has furnished increased income, employment, brought new businesses to the county and touches many facets of our society. It has brought about the establishment of extra storage capacity for the small grains, justified the establishment of a poultry disease diagnostic laboratory to better serve the people of the southeastern part of the state. So you can readily see that the poultry industry and especially the broiler industry has had tremendous impact on the economic life of SENCA-

land. These are the things you can readily see, There are other hidden values that have not been mentioned, such as the value of the poultry manure. This has been used in many instances to enrich poor soil to the extent that it will raise grass abundantly and enable farmers to establish beef as an industry on many farms that

did not keep cattle before.

With new technology and a strong possibility of being able to secure favorable freight rates on the feed ingredients

that we need to import should make poultry more attractive. The coming of the poultry in-dustry into Eastern Carolina has made available a market

annually for several million dollars of cereal grains.

I want to thank you for the


