

Wilson Man Dead After Dispute With Wallace Man

J. Macy Batts was found dead at his Wilson home early Saturday with two bullet wounds in his chest.

Kenneth Teachey of Wallace it is alleged was later found about a block from the Batts' home in his automobile in an unconscious condition. His condition is reported satisfactory in a Wilson hospital where he is being treated for injuries app-

arently received by being beaten over the head with a blunt instrument.

It is asserted that Mrs. Batts claims her husband and Teachey argued during the previous evening.

A .22-caliber pistol and a .410-gauge shotgun were found beside the body.

Discount Tobacco Program Continued For 64

The fine-cured tobacco discount variety program will be continued in effect for the 1964 crop, Rufus Elks, Jr., Office Manager for the Duplin Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee, reminded tobacco growers today.

Under this program, price supports for discount varieties are one-half the support rates of comparable grades of acceptable varieties. The discount varieties include Coker 139, Coker 316, Reams 64, and Dixie Bright 244. Any mixture or strain of these seed varieties, or any breeding line of fine-cured varieties, including 187 Golden Wilt, also designated as No Name XYZ, Mortgage Lifter, Super XYZ, having the quality and chemical characteristics of the five varieties will be designated as discount varieties.

Mr. Elks, urged every grower to obtain his tobacco seed from reliable sources. By doing this, he will be protected against the planting of mixed or inferior seed. As in past years, tobacco will be checked while it is growing in the field. Any tobacco having growth characteristics and chemical properties similar to a discount variety will be supported at one-half the support rate for acceptable varieties. So it is most important that each farmer be sure of the variety of tobacco he plants.

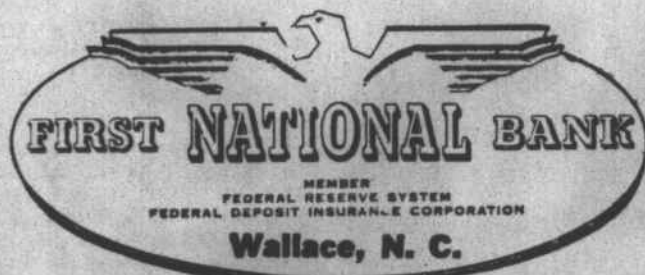
