PITTSBURGH - One of the hardest working teams at the Methodist General Conference in session at Pittsburgh April 26-May 9 is the Rev. Ted Wilson of Warsaw, N. C. and his father, the Rev. W. Carleton Wilson of Durham.

This is the third General Conference in which the elder Wilson has edited the General Conference Journal. The Journal contains all the details, committees, proceedings etc. of the two week-session and every word uttered on the conference floor. The elder Wilson is also editor of the N. C. Conference Journal which covers 56 eastern and piedmont N. C. counties.

Ted is attending his first General Conference and ably assists his father as assistant secretary. He is concluding his seventh year as pastor of the Warsaw Methodist Church. He is also a working member of the staff of the North Carolina Annual Conference and heads the recording of proceedings there.

The Methodist General Conference meets every four years and embraces the worldwide Methodist Church. It is

the only legislative or law-making body of the Methodist Church and is currently wrest-

ling with some key issues. There are 858 elected delegates from the United States and 44 overseas countries. Half of the delegates are lay and half clerical and are elected in

each local Annual Conference of the denomination.

The Wilsons are the only father-son team working on the General Conference staff of 1964.

Recently the President signed into law a bill which I sincerely feel will bring a new period of progress and expansion to both our cotton-producing and our cotton-manufacturing industries.

This bill became law after many, many months of hard work on the part of both industry and Congressional leaders and it will enable the American textile mills to buy American-produced cotton at the same price foreign mills have been buying American-produced cotton. For several years foreign mills have been able to buy American-produced cotton for about \$42.50 a bale cheaper than American mills could buy the same cotton.

payments at the rate of 8-1/2 cents between now and August 1st. In order for the program authorized under the bill to go into full effect immediately.

There is still some question about how some of the details of the program will operate after August 1st and the Department has scheduled hearings in Charlotte on April 30 and May 1 and in Memphis, Tennessee, on May 4 and 5 to work out final arrangements.

All in all, this new law is far from perfect, but there is no doubt about the fact that it is a definite step in the right direction. The new law will bring about more demand for cotton which will be of tremendous benefit to cotton farmers and at the same time enable textile mills to more nearly meet the competition of synthetic fibers and foreign imports.
