#### Warsaw Water Lines To Be Flushed

Water Customers of the Town of Warsaw were notified that on Saturday, May 16, and Sunday, May 17, water lines of the Town of Warsaw will be sterilized and flushed under the supervision of the State Board of Health. Water in the lines will be sterilized by heavy concentrations of chlorine, which will render the water undersirable for HUMAN CON-SUMPTION AND DOMESTIC PURPOSES during the flushing period


Users were notified to prepare water for HUMAN CON-SUMPTION AND DOMESTIC PURPOSES to last for the period 12:00 Noon Saturday, May 16, to 6:00 p. m. Sunday, May

When you wake up Sunday morning, May 17, open your hot and cold water faucets in house and outside until chlorine odor comes through. Then shut faucets tightly. This will allow household water lines to benefit from treatment.

Please avoid flushing toilets with treated water or allowing treated water to enter sewer or private septic tank. (You can flush toilet by emptying a bucket of stored water in the bowl.)

When treatment period is over (about 6:00 p. m., Sunday, May 17, or earlier) two short signals will be given on fire siren. At that time, you should drain your outside Faucets until chlorine odor has disappear-

# Senator Jordan Cotton

By Sen. B. Everett Jordan Recently the President signed into law a bill which I sincerely feel will bring a new period of progress and expansion to both our cotton-producing and our cotton-manufacturing industries.

This bill became law after many, many months of hard work on the part of both industry and Congressional leaders and it will enable the American textile mills to buy Americanproduced cotton at the same price foreign mills have been buying American-produced cot ton. For several years foreign mills have been able to buy American-produced cotton for about \$42.50 a bale cheaper than American mills could buy the same cotton

This, of course, has put the American mills at a distinct disadvantage and it has created very serious problems for cotton producers since a great many mills have been shifting from cotton to synthetic fibers.

I was an original co-sponsor of the bill that was enacted into law and I worked very closely with leaders in both the House and the Senate in getting it enacted. President Johnson invited me to be on hand at the White House at noon when he signed the bill and he was thoughtful enough to give me one of the pens he used in signing it into law.

The program under the new law will not go into full effect until August 1, 1964.

The Department of Agriculture has announced an interim program to be in effect between now and then. Under the interim program, American mills will be given certificates representing the amount of cotton they open and use between April 11 and August 1, 1964. These certificates will be valued at the rate of about 6-1/2 cents per pound for the cotton opened and used between

now and August 1. I had hoped the Department would go ahead and make the payments at the rate of 8-1/2 cents between now and August 1st. in order for the program authorized under the bill to go into full effect immediately.

There is still some question about how some of the details of the program will operate after August 1st and the Department has scheduled hearings in Charlotte on April 30 and May 1 and in Memphis. Tennessee, on May 4 and 5 to work out final arrangements.

All in all, this new law is far from perfect, but there is no doubt about the fact that it is a definite step in the right direction. The new law will bring about more demand for cotton which will be of tremendous benefit to cotton farmers and at the same time enable textile mills to more nearly meet the competition of synthetic fibers and foriegn imports.
