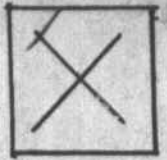

## Respiratory Diseases Thief of Time

"Procrastination is a mere runner-up when it comes to stealing time", stated Dr. E. L. Boyette, president of the Dup-

lin County Tuberculosis Association. "The real thief of time is RD-Respiratory Disease - which costs this community many thousands of man-days each year.

Speaking in behalf of the TB Association of the current RD Symptom Alert on chronic cough and shortness of breath, Dr. Boyette declared that "second in importance only to the question of health and life, Respiratory Disease poses an economic problem of vast magnitude."

The efforts of the Duplin County Tuberculosis Association to increase public awareness of chronic cough and shortness of breath, as indications of Respiratory Disease deserve the support of every civic organization in the county.

"Either of these symptoms may signify a condition which, if neglected beyond a certain length of time, may lead to extremely serious disorders of the breathing system." The Christmas Seal organization is co-ordinating its six week RD Alert with the nation wide program of the National Tuberculosis Association under the slogan, "Cough too much? Short of breath? Don't take chances. See your doctor." The alert which has no fund-raising aspect, is financed by Christmas Seal funds.
