has been concentrated on tuberculosis contacts, suspects, old cases, those persons who show a positive tuberculin reaction, and others routinely X-rayed by the health department and who require a health card.

All TB contacts over 12 years of age and their families should come in for X-ray. Others who should come in are Food Handlers, Teachers and other school personnel (bus drivers, janitors etc.). Cosmetologists and Barbers, or any person who requires a health card. Any interested person above the age of 12 will be X-rayed.
