They may be called by more old fashioned and often unkind names, but the fact remains that these children suffer from a handicap and are entitled to the same love and affection and understanding that other children receive. Unless you have a retarded child in your family, it is doubtful that you have ever given much thought to this problem but you never know when a mentally retarded child will touch your life. For 3 out of every hundred parents in Duplin County, a child will be different. There are as many as 1,200 in the county now. Mental Retardation is every-
