

## Dr. Patterson To Speak At Magnolia Homecoming

Dr. I. N. Patterson, Visiting Professor of Missions, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Wake Forest, N. C., will be the guest speaker.

Dr. Patterson, a native of Alabama, went to Nigeria, Africa in 1934 and has served in the following positions as a missionary of the Southern Baptist Convention:

Principal, Baptist Boys' High School, Abeokuta, Nigeria, 1925-1944.

Supt. Churches of Abeokuta and Oko-ogun area, 1925-1944. Secretary Treasurer, Nigerian Mission, F.M.B., S.B.C. 1944-1952.

General Secretary, Nigerian Baptist Convention, 1944-1952. Dr. Patterson holds the B. A. degree from Howard College,

Alabama, the Th. M. degree from Southern Seminary, Louisville, the D. D. degree, Howard College and the O.B.E. degree (Honorary Officer of the British Empire).

In addition to serving as Editor of the "Nigerian Baptist, 1929-38, Dr. Patterson is author of the book, "Continents in Commotion," 1956.

Dr. and Mrs. Patterson are now living in Wake Forest where he is serving as Visiting Professor of Missions.

The Homecoming Day Services will begin with Sunday School at 10:00 A.M., followed by the Morning Worship Hour at 11:00 A.M.

After the Worship Hour there will be a picnic lunch.

tis, about 6,000 become mentally retarded. Don't expose your child to measles and its possible life long after effects. There are now safe, effective vaccines to prevent this childhood disease.

There's an old saying that money can't buy happiness, but it can. There are several million mentally retarded children growing up in this country for whom money can buy the special education, training, and help they need, and help costs money.

In every city, town and village in the nation there are children who are mentally retarded. They may be called by more old fashioned and often unkind names, but the fact remains that these children suffer from a handicap and are entitled to the same love and affection and understanding that other children receive. Unless you have a retarded child in your family, it is doubtful that you have ever given much thought to this problem but you never know when a mentally retarded child will touch your life. For 3 out of every hundred parents in Duplin County, a child will be different. There are as many as 1,200 in the county now. Mental Retardation is everybody's battle. There are 2 million mentally retarded people working today - qualified, capable and eager to earn their way.

Duplin County Association for Retarded Children has its aim to help every retardate in our county. This organization contributes to research; contributes to State and National Associations yearly; helps to support the trainable class at Rose Hill (children with 25-50 I.Q.); purchased Station Wagon for children in the trainable class and have ordered another in order to let more children attend; and at present, plans are in the making for a sheltered workshop for the adult retardates.

If you have a retarded child or know of one, please contact Mrs. P. G. Blanton, Rose Hill, President of this organization,

so that this retarded child can be led to the help he needs so badly. Is it fair for this child to go without help, simply because he cannot ask for it? By research, pointing the way to prevention and cure of retardation and special education, much can be done for the retarded.

Now, during National Retarded Children's week - which runs from November 13th through Thanksgiving Day - find out from Duplin County Association for Retarded Children. How you can help. There are many ways of helping - with understanding, with concern, with time and with support.

Every five minutes, a baby is born in the United States who will be mentally retarded, but thanks to research, many parents will be spared this heartache.


## AT HOME WITH PARENTS
