Try Home-made Cookies for Winter Snacks

Cold winter days are the best time for making a hit with home-made cookies. It's the time when the children come in hungry from a hard day's play, when the girls get in out of the cold for a cozy coffee klatch and when the man of the house is most likely to invade the kitchen for a late night snack.

The beauty of cookies is that they're so satisfying yet so easy to make. With the right tools, a batch of cookies can be made with little risk of error and practically no clean-up worries.

For example, you can now get non-stick aluminum cookie pans that need no greasing, eliminate the chance of cookies sticking and can be cleaned with a simple rinsing. As with the popular non-stick frying pans, aluminum is used because its even-heating qualities work best with the durable plastic coating, reports The Aluminum Association.

Here is a simple recipe for a cookie that will score with everybody:

**CHOCOLATE CHIP NUT COOKIES**  
To make about 45 cookies:  
Cream together 1/2 cup butter, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup white sugar.  
Beat in 1 egg, 1/2 tsp. vanilla.  
Sift and stir in 1 cup flour, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. soda.  
Stir in 1/2 cup chopped nut meats, 1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips.  
Drop on cookie pan with a teaspoon and bake at 375 degrees for about 10 minutes.
