GARDEN TIME
 By M. E. GARDNER
 N. C. State University
 A good many requests have been received for information about fruit trees which require less space than standard sorts. Fortunately, we do have a rather good collection of varieties grafted on dwarfing rootstocks which are very desirable for planting around the home where space is a problem.
 First the apples:
 Varieties are available on Malling No. 9 rootstock. This is the most dwarfing type, the trees reaching a height of from 6 to 10 feet at maturity. They bear early, sometimes at the end of the second growing season, if well attended.
 They should be planted in good soil and staked for support until they are well established in the soil. They may also be supported by a wire trellis, a wall or lattice support - Espalier training.
 These varieties are satisfactory: Yellow Transparent, Golden Delicious and Richard Delicious (or Winesap or Stayman Winesap).
 It is important to remember that I am giving fruitful combinations and varieties which I know are available on Malling 9 rootstock. Both Winesap and Stayman are self- and cross-unfruitful so Golden Delicious is necessary as a source of viable and compatible pollen to fertilize the blossoms of Winesap and Stayman.
 Second, the peach:
 The dwarf type peach varieties and self-fruitful and, when mature, are about 8 feet tall. This makes for easy pruning and spraying as well as space conservation.
 We have a good selection of varieties, too. Here they are with flesh color in parenthesis: Erly-Red Fre (white); If you do not object to white flesh, it is one of the best of the early sorts; Hale Haven (yellow); Red-haven (yellow); and the old favorite, Elberta. Georgia Belle (white) is also available and has, for years, been a favorite variety of people in Piedmont North Carolina.
 Third, the pear:
 I am only recommending two dwarf type pear varieties, both of which are resistant to fire

 Md., showed beautiful color slides of trees in bloom and leaf coloration in the fall.
 This relatively new ornamental tree has prolific and beautiful white flowers; silvery, glossy green foliage in summer changing to crimson to dark red in the fall; the fruits are few, russet colored and inconspicuous. They hold on well into the winter (in the South) and are said to be attractive to birds; growth habit is upright, compact and non-thorny; it is hardy and resistant to fire blight and other common pear diseases.
 When mature, Bradford reaches a height of about 60 feet. It appears that this tree would be desirable as a specimen plant in a large yard. It might also be attractive planted on both sides of a road leading into an estate. It is also recommended for street planting where it will not compete with utility wires.
 I know of two possible sources of nursery stock and will send you the addresses if you wish to try this new ornamental variety.
 Hear ye! Hear ye! It's that time again - man's never ending battle against insect disease pests. Aphid eggs are ready to crack and insects of all kinds are poised to wake up from their deep winter sleep and bop you one.
 And that ain't all. The diseases are also ready to break out of winter quarters and shoot more disease spores at you than you can get from a battery of 20 gauge shotguns loaded with number nine bird shot.
