ing in March, 1952. Having started with 16 members the club has never had fewer members than this. Membership is by invitation only.

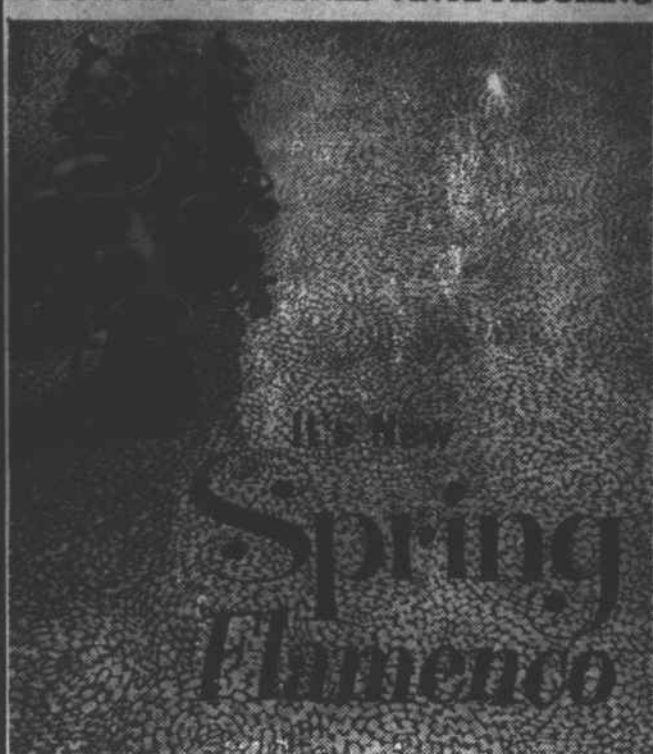
Presently they are involved in two projects, renovating the interior of the club building and seeding and planting shrubbery beside the railroad tract.

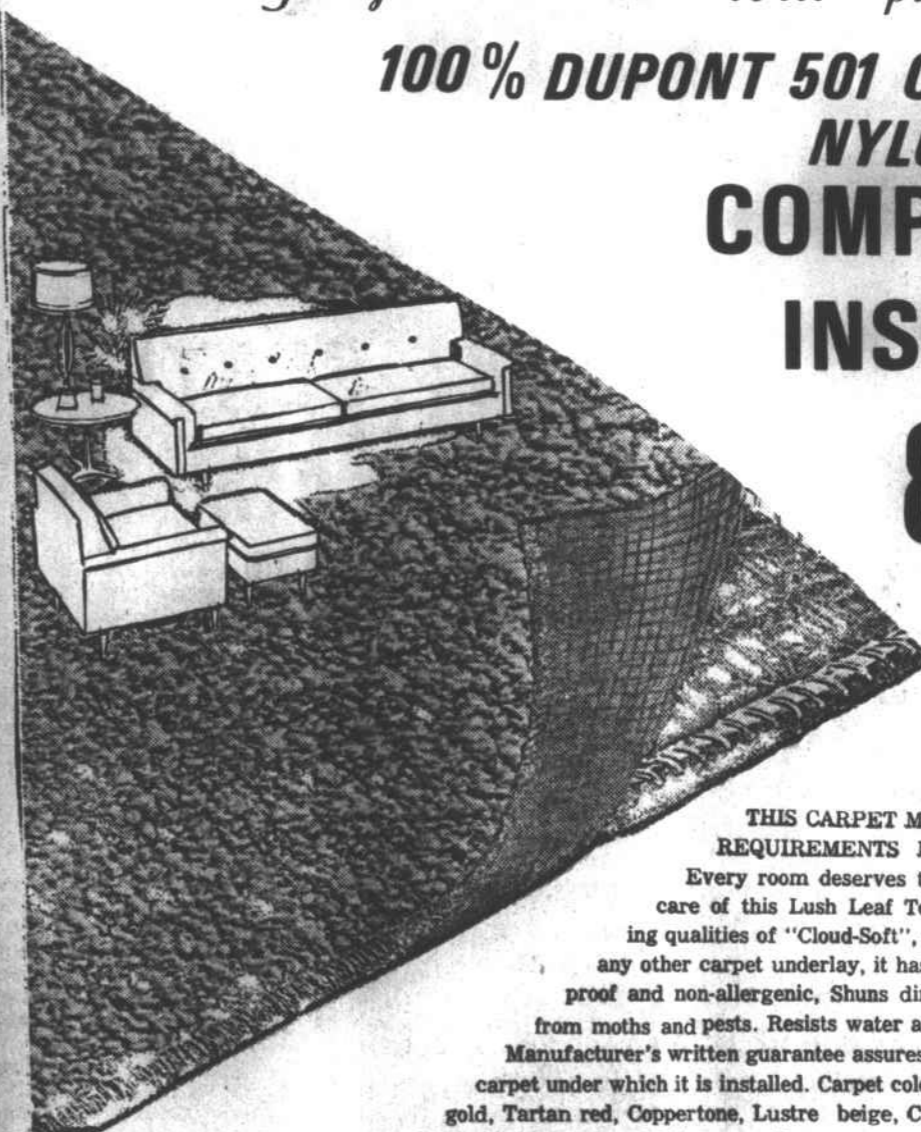
