"We want everyone in the Beatusonus, Calypso and Faison areas who has relatives or friends in the armed services in Vietnam to call us as soon as possible," Chairman Avent declared. "The Jaycees want to send them cartons of cigarettes."

Chairman Avent said he could be contacted by calling 658-3051 during the day and 287-4941 at night.

"We want to send cigarettes to our fighting men in Vietnam and Thailand, who are natives of our area, to show our appreciation and gratitude," Chairman Avent pointed out. "It is part of the North Carolina Jaycee public relations project."

Faison Jaycees are contacting businesses, organizations and other groups in the North Duplin area to secure "Ciga-

rettes for Vietnam" orders. The cigarettes cost about \$1.00 a carton.

The cartons will be shipped directly to General William Westmoreland in Vietnam for distribution to servicemen from the North Duplin area, Chairman Avent stated.

Each pack will acknowledge the donor. The packs will be labeled with the North Caro-

lina Jaycee emblem, the Faison Jaycee club name, and the local donor's name and address. Each carton of cigarettes will have a pre-addressed post card for recipients to return to the donor.

National Director Charles Harrell of Mount Olive is serving as state chairman of the "Cigarettes for Vietnam" project.
