


Good Season Forecast

Kepley estimates that be tween 25,000 and 35,000 visitors will be here each week from June through Septem-ber. "These are conservative figures - actually we expect better season than last 8 year," he said.

area. They are welcome to join in the activities of the South Isle Surfing Club. Kepley said that all safeguards are taken to protect persons enjoying water sports, "As long as there are people on the beach you will see lifeguards," he em-phasized.




