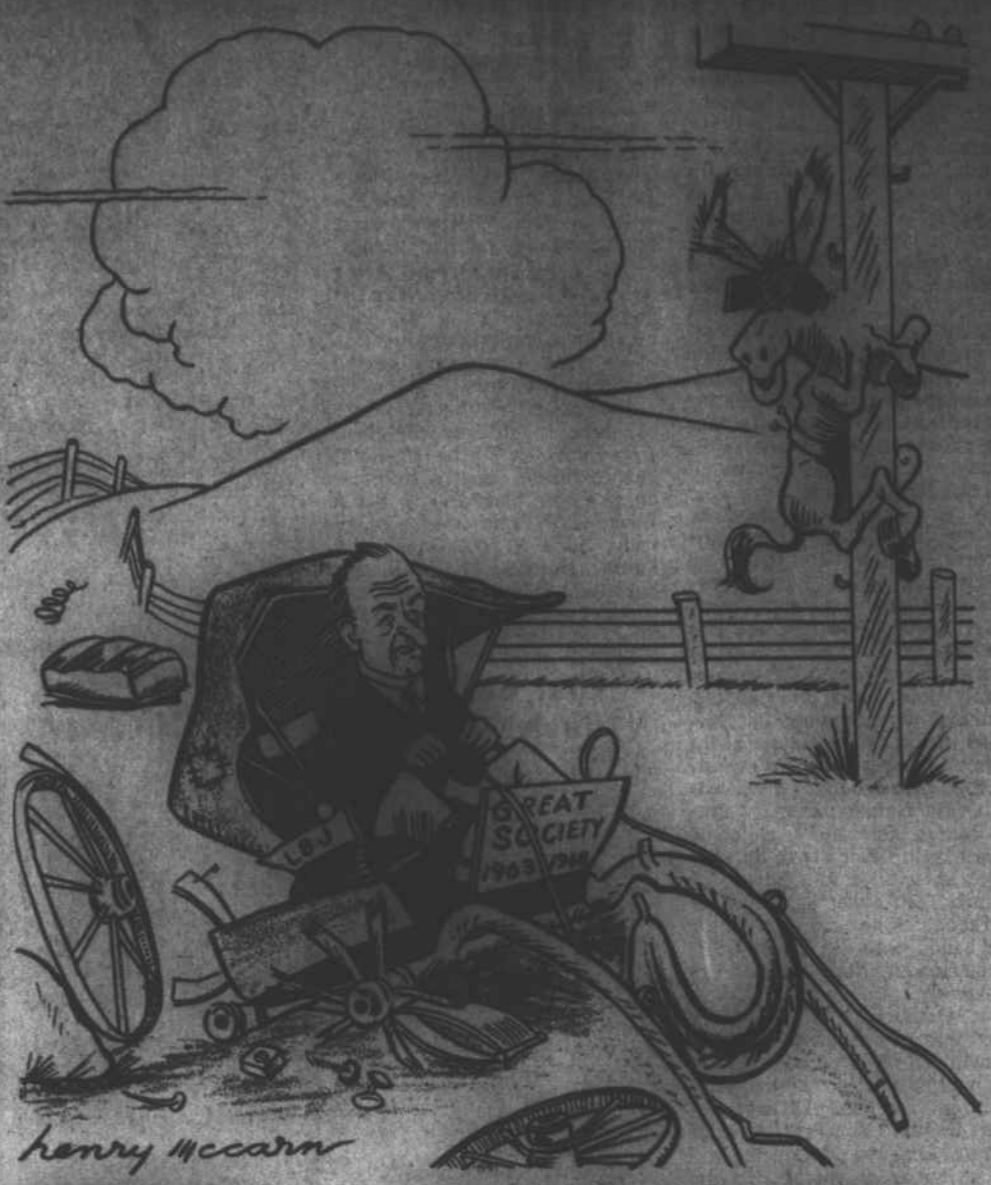
Dear Mrs. Grady:
