supply more in line with the demand. This resolution was opposed by the delegates from Duplin County. Urged limited early opening of markets other than those in the Old Belt. Opposed excise taxes on tobacco products at the State, County or Municipal level. Urged all warehouses to follow the practice of reserving floor space for growers. Called for accelerated research on tobacco mechanization. Delegates also endorsed pr-

esent farm programs "until better programs are developed to improve prices" and marketing; expressed support for a move to modernize the interest rate structure in North Carolina; opposed any additional State or National controls on firearms and called for a thorough investigation of the State's broiler industry to expose "unfair and unjust trade practices" that might exist.
