Elections of A & C community committees will be conducted by mail during the period September 5 - 16. Three committeemen and two alternates will be elected to serve one-year terms. The newly-elected committeemen also will be official delegates to the county convention where farmers will be elected to fill vacancies on the Duplin ASC

County Committee.

Those eligible to vote in the community committee elec-tions also have the right to nominate by petition candidates for committee membership, Such petitions, each one nominating one candidate and signed by six or more eligible voters, must be filed at the Duplin County A S'C Office by August 21. Eligible voters may sign as many petitions as they wish. Additional nominations may be made by the incumbent ASC community and county commit-tees. Regulations require that while re minority group members make up at least 10 percent of the eligible voters in a community, a minority group member must be put on the slate of candidates unless one or more is nominated by
