

Wing Of Rest Home Nears Completion

D. J. Fussell Construction Co., contracting contractor in this area, reports to have the second wing of Whaley Rest Home ready for residents by early October.

Whaley Rest Home is owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. J. B. (John and Carolyn) Hall of Kenansville.

Ground breaking for the initial unit was held in March 1957. D. J. Fussell Construction Company was chosen to erect the thirty-four bed new story, all electric facility.

A waiting list filled the Rest Home almost over night and soon plans were announced for a wing to be added on the east side of the original structure. This was completed and occupied in October 1958.

"I see an unlimited future for Kenansville and the Hills," said Mr. Fussell. "This is real-

ly just the beginning. These people have shown the way of life now prevailing, and have provided facilities with the quality of services provided by the Hills, there is no limit to their possibilities."

The wing erected at the west end of the original structure will bring to 76 the number of beds in the Rest Home. This includes private rooms, semi-private, private room with bath,

Pipeline - Over 5 Miles Long

A French manufacturer has received an order for two 350,000-gallon tanks for intermediate storage of mineral water, requiring 45 tons of Type 304 stainless steel (10,000 pounds of nickel). The pageant to select the new queen will be held at 8 o'clock p. m. Thursday, October 2, 1959 in Kenan Memorial Auditorium in Kenansville.

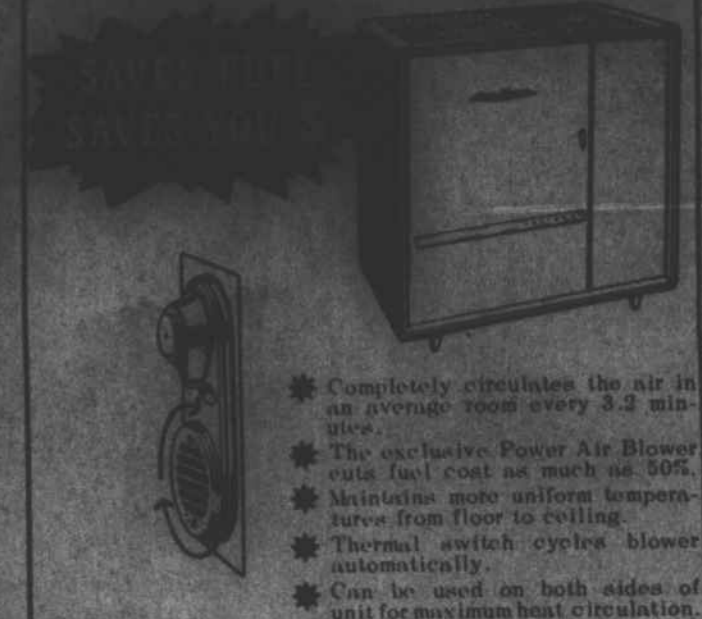
